

COMMUNITY WORK SERVICE ADVISORY

Community Service, as the name implies, is service offered to your community without any compensation other than the satisfaction of knowing that you have done something that will benefit your fellow citizens. It follows, then, that community service can only be performed for public institutions that are supported by tax dollars, charitable and charitable nonprofit agencies and organizations. To guide you in your search of an appropriate community service site for you, listed below are some worksites others have used to fulfill their community service obligations.

It is a privilege, not a right, to be granted the option of community service as opposed to more punitive sanctions. But, be advised that it is entirely your responsibility to locate your own worksite. If you fail to do so, the Court will be forced to impose more serious sanctions.
