

BRUNSWICK TOWNSHIP **APPROVED** MEETING MINUTES
September 13, 2010

The regular meeting of the Brunswick Town Board of Supervisors was held at the Town Hall on Monday, September 13, 2010 at 8:00 p.m. The following were in attendance: Rick Kawalek, Paul Kollar; Craig Peterson; Arlett Mizer; Gladys Nelson; Susan Alderink absent. The meeting was called to order by Chairman, Rick Kawalek and the flag pledge was said. A sign-in sheet was provided for all in attendance.

M/S/C by Kawalek and Kollar to approve the agenda. M/S/C by Peterson and Kollar to approve the minutes of the August 9, 2010 meeting with 1 noted correction – Lawrence Beets represented landowner, William Groth. The treasurer reported total funds available on August 31, 2010 of \$ 94,957.03. M/S/C by Peterson and Kollar to approve the treasurer report. M/S/C by Peterson and Kollar to approve the claims.

BUSINESS FROM FLOOR: None

OLD BUSINESS: **Road Projects:** KCR prepared an estimate for the Mahogany Street road project:

**6" of pit run – 1700 feet - \$ 5,250.

**6" of Class 5 – WHOLE road about 1.5 mile - \$ 11,050.

**labor to put in culvert - \$ 1,020.

**cost of 41" x 30' culvert from County - \$ 715.27; band cost \$ 43.51

**if needed, ditch slope work is \$ 1,000.

**it is noted that estimate is not 2900 feet but 1700 feet; gravel for entire road

M/S/C by Kawalek and Peterson to have KCR Construction do the Mahogany Street road project to specifications on estimate provided. Project is to be completed before winter freeze-up.

Kadlec Construction reported to the Clerk that Lumber Street had been seeded on August 24th; erosion has been fixed. Paul is to check to see that the culvert has been cleaned.

KCR Construction was requested to replace the culvert on 130th Avenue near the George Johnsen property (culvert has hole).

Niemi Driveway: There was a meeting at the Kanabec Courthouse with various government bodies represented that discussed the complaints received on the driveway. MN Pollution Control Agency officials stated this is an ongoing investigation in their office. Town Attorney Kevin Hofstad was contacted after August meeting and began work for the Town; upon hearing of the investigation by MN PCA, he contacted the Clerk. Attorney Hofstad asked if he should continue work on the tire shred issue for the Town; Board Chairman Kawalek asked him to stop until the PCA was finished with their investigation. Further discussion was held including an interim ordinance to allow further study by the Town.

M/S/C by Kawalek and Peterson – The Brunswick Board of Supervisors adopt an Interim Ordinance that bans the use of shredded tires on private property within the Township. The Planning Commission has up to one year to review the use of shredded tires on private property. This ordinance is being put into place because of complaints from town residents. The Clerk is to publish the Interim Ordinance one time in the newspaper; place on posting place and notify the Zoning Administrator.




NEW BUSINESS: Zoning Administrator was not present at meeting but reported the issuance of one land use permit. Gary Runquist requested details of permit; Rick will call.

Richard Hass reported fallen trees on Lewis Lake public access road; trees can not be cut with chain saw and need to be reached with a tree trimmer or loader. The Board approved KCR to do the work with their loader.
