

BRUNSWICK TOWNSHIP APPROVED MEETING MINUTES

July 12, 2010

The regular meeting of the Brunswick Town Board of Supervisors was held at the Town Hall on Monday, July 12, 2010 at 8:00 p.m. The following were in attendance: Rick Kawalek, Paul Kollar; Craig Peterson; Arlett Mizer; Gladys Nelson; Susan Alderink. The meeting was called to order by Chairman, Rick Kawalek and the flag pledge was said. A sign-in sheet was provided for all in attendance.

M/S/C by Kawalek and Kollar to approve the agenda. M/S/C by Peterson and Kollar to approve the minutes of the June 14, 2010 meeting. The treasurer reported total funds available on June 30, 2010 of \$ 104,838.87. M/S/C by Peterson and Kawalek to approve the treasurer report. M/S/C by Peterson and Kawalek to approve the claims.

BUSINESS FROM FLOOR: Dennis McNally, spokesman for citizen on County Road 12, spoke to the Board regarding placement of new drive way on the property owned by Monte Niemi. The following is noted: many trucks of shredded tires were placed in the driveway; felt Susan, Zoning Administrator, should have asked owner to post a bond; residents felt a hole about 20 feet deep was dug with the fill being piled and the hole filled with tires was not proper; who is responsible for well damage for neighbors; it was verified from Susan that owner received a permit from the Town for a culvert driveway approach on the Township road; citizens felt a liner should have been placed in hole and stated they had been in conversation with the MN Pollution Control Agency regarding these actions; asked the board who is going to pursue this problem – the citizens or Town Board.

Land Owner, Monte Niemi, responded there is no need to encapsulate tires, they do not leach and wanted a good roadbed that matches the County Road. Monte also stated the project would be completed in 2-3 weeks. No action taken by the Board.

OLD BUSINESS: Groundhouse River road project: M/S/C by Peterson and Kollar the Brunswick Town Board was satisfied with the insurance coverage as provided to the Town Clerk and it is OK to proceed with the road project.

Mahogany Street: Monte, along with KCR Construction, did soil borings on Mahogany Street and reported there was material between the logs that could be use for placement above the tires. It is noted that Grass Lake Township has voted unanimous to do the project if within the cost parameter of \$10,000 - \$ 14,000 per Township. The next step – First State Tire is to come up with a plan, in consultation with Richard Larsen, and bring to August meeting.

NEW BUSINESS: Zoning Administrator issued 3 land use permits – Eric Herges, pole shed; Kevin Fore, gazebo; Duane Munsterteiger, lot line adjustment. It is also noted that there is no word on the Johnson/Coleman lot line dispute.

M/S/C by Kawalek and Kollar to adjourn the meeting at 9:40 p.m.
