October 11, 2000

The Kanabec County Board of Commissioners met at 9:00am on Wednesday, October 11, 2000 pursuant to adjournment with the following Board Members present: Dennis Schulz, Stan Cooper, Dennis McNally and Dave Ulstrom.

It was moved by Dennis McNally, and seconded by Dennis Schulz, and carried unanimously to approve the agenda as amended.

9:04am - Dave Pauly with the DNR met with the County Board to again request approval of the board for the Department of Natural Resources, Division of Wildlife to purchase private property in Southfork Township. Also present were property owners Greg & Elaine Bartholomy, Realtor June Jensen and Southfork Township Supervisor Duane Munsterteiger. Following discussion, it was agreed that the property owners would bring back further information about whether a septic system is possible on this property.

9:08am - Commissioner Tom Roeschlein arrived.

9:35am - Auditor/Treasurer Denise Cooper met with the County Board to discuss matters concerning her office.

It was moved by Dennis Schulz, and seconded by Stan Cooper, and **carried** unanimously to approve the following resolution:

Resolution 1 - 10/11/00

WHEREAS, Kanabec County begins its budget process as early as practical in the calendar year in order to maximize input by all concerned parties and allow full review of all expenditure items; and,

WHEREAS, there are numerous factors that are beyond the control of county boards and that can potentially cause tax rates to rise, including but not limited to:

- a. Class rate changes by the state on various types of property,
- b. The economy and its effect on the tax base, including real estate and new construction growth or lack thereof,
- c. Tax Increment Financing (TIF) districts created by cities,
- d. Limitations on what percentage the market value of property can rise each year as set by the state, and
- e. Unfunded mandates upon local governments and reductions of federal and state

aid; and,

WHEREAS, because of these outside factors beyond control, a county may need to have a higher tax rate for the following year, and if the tax rate has to go up, Kanabec County wishes to be in compliance with the law with an authorizing resolution adopted and filed; and,

WHEREAS, Kanabec County's property tax levy has been set each year within the levy limitations imposed by the State of Minnesota; and,

WHEREAS, even during those years when the state has not enacted levy limitations, Kanabec County has had its own self-imposed levy limitations to protect the interests of the county's property taxpayers:

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that if the tax rate of Kanabec County for the year 2001 is higher than the tax rate certified by the county auditor under clause (3) of Section 2, Article 6, Chapter 243, Laws of Minnesota 2000, the higher tax rate is hereby authorized by the Board of Commissioners, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that regardless of outside factors impacting tax rates, the board of commissioners remains firmly committed to the delivery of mandated and other important services at a cost within established levy limits in order to hold down property taxes of the citizens of Kanabec County, and

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED that an official copy of this adopted resolution be filed with the County Auditor/Treasurer.

It was moved by Dennis McNally, and seconded by Dennis Schulz, and **carried** unanimously to approve the following resolution:

WHEREAS, the Kanabec County Board and the affected local community, as well as the general public, share a common concern for the safety of those people using this road segment.

WHEREAS, the crime of domestic violence violates an individual's privacy, dignity, security and humanity, due to the systematic use of physical, emotional, sexual, psychological, and economic control or abuse;

WHEREAS, in our country, more than three women are murdered by their husbands or boyfriends every day, and approximately 1 million incidents of domestic violence are reported in the United States in 1998.

WHEREAS, children who grow up in violent homes are believed to be abused and

neglected at a rate higher than the national average;

WHEREAS, domestic violence costs the nation billions of dollars annually in medical expenses, police, and court costs, shelters and foster care, sick leave, absenteeism, and non-productivity;

WHEREAS, a coalition of organizations has emerged to directly confront this crisis such as law enforcement officials, those involved with shelters and crisis line services, health care providers, the clergy, and other concerned citizens are helping in the effort to end domestic violence. We must recognize the compassion and dedication of these volunteers and professionals, applaud their efforts, and increase public understanding of this important problem.

NOW THEREFORE, I do hereby proclaim the month of October to be National Domestic Violence Awareness Month and urge all citizens to observe this month by becoming aware of the tragedy of domestic violence, supporting those who are working toward its end, and participating in community efforts.
