The Kanabec County Board of Commissioners met at 9:00am on Wednesday, October 13, 1999 pursuant to adjournment with the following Board Members present: Dennis McNally, Dennis Schulz, Dave Ulstrom, Tom Roeschlein and Stan Cooper.

It was moved by Dennis McNally, seconded by Dave Ulstrom and **carried** unanimously to approve the agenda as amended.

9:05am - Larry Nelson with Onanagozie RC & D met with the County Board to present the annual Onanagozie RC & D update. No action was taken at this time.

KANABEC COUNTY PROPERTY TAX ABATEMENT POLICY

I. POLICY STATEMENT

Minnesota Statute 375.192 provides for a method of correcting clerical errors and taxpayer over sites as they may relate to current property taxes payable. The following abatement policy procedure is adopted in accordance with this section.

II. POLICY GUIDELINES

The County board may grant the reduction or abatement of taxes and any costs, penalties, or interest on them as they deem just and equitable. Reductions or abatements will be considered by the county board only for:

A. **Homestead Credit**

If a taxpayer fails to file for homestead classification or if homestead credit is denied for failure to file a certificate of real estate value with the county auditor.

1. Homestead abatements may only be granted for taxes payable in the current year.
2. Homestead abatements requests must be filed by May 31 of the year in which the taxes are payable.
3. Homestead abatement applications must be accompanied by:
 - a. Receipts from two utility companies, covering two consecutive months when occupancy commenced.
 - b. Current *approved* homestead application.

B. **County Clerical Errors**

Reductions or adjustments may be granted only as they relate to taxes payable in the current year or for two prior years.

Written application for a reduction or abatement must be made by the owner of the property concerned.

No abatement request will be accepted in regard to market value or

classification disputes. State statutes allow sufficient time for these appeals and adjustments during the "Truth in Taxation" assessed value notification and review processes.

No reduction or abatement may be granted on the basis of providing an incentive for economic development or redevelopment.

All applications must be approved by the county assessor and the county auditor/ treasurer before consideration by the county board except that the part of the application which is for the abatement of penalty or interest need only be approved by the county auditor/treasurer.

11:22am - PC Systems Administrator DeAnna Lilienthal met with the County Board to discuss matters concerning computer hardware and software.

It was moved by Tom RoeschleinIt was moved by Stan Cooper, and **carried** unanimously to authorize the release of bid specifications for computer equipment.

It was moved by Stan Cooper to purchase jail-only software at \$6,000.00; motion **failed** for lack of a second.

12:15pm - Kelly Osterdyk, Kanabec County Soil & Water Conservation, met with the County Board to discuss matters concerning Water Plan activities.

It was moved by Tom Roeschlein, and seconded by Dave Ulstrom, and **carried** unanimously to authorize 12 to 15 water samples in Section 6 of Peace Township to be paid from Water Plan Grant Funds.

10:00pm - Auditor/Treasurer Denise Cooper met with the County Board to discuss matters concerning her office.

It was moved by Dave Ulstrom, and seconded by Stan Cooper, and **carried** unanimously to pass the following resolution:

Resolution 99-10/13-4

WHEREAS, Kanabec County begins its budget process as early as practical in the calendar year in order to maximize input by all concerned parties and allow full review of all expenditure items; and,

WHEREAS, there are numerous factors that are beyond the control of county boards and that can potentially cause tax rates to rise, including but not limited to:

- a. Class rate changes by the state on various types of property,
- b. The economy and its effect on the tax base, including real estate and new construction growth or lack thereof,
- c. Tax Increment Financing (TIF) districts created by cities,
- d. Limitations on what percentage the market value of property can rise each year as set by the state, and
- e. Unfunded mandates upon local governments and reductions of federal and state aid; and,

WHEREAS, because of these outside factors beyond control, a county may need to have a higher tax rate for the following year, and if the tax rate has to go up, Kanabec County wishes to be in compliance with the law with an authorizing resolution adopted and filed; and,

WHEREAS, Kanabec County's property tax levy has been set each year within the levy limitations imposed by the State of Minnesota; and,

WHEREAS, even during those years when the state has not enacted levy limitations, Kanabec County has had its own self-imposed levy limitations to protect the interests of the county's property taxpayers:

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that if the tax rate of Kanabec County for the year 2000 is higher than the tax rate certified by the county auditor under clause (3) of Section 2, Article 6, Chapter 243, Laws of Minnesota 1999, the higher tax rate is hereby authorized by the Board of Commissioners, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that regardless of outside factors impacting tax rates, the board of commissioners remains firmly committed to the delivery of mandated and other important services at a cost within established levy limits in order to hold down property taxes of the citizens of Kanabec County, and

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED that an official copy of this adopted resolution be filed with the County Auditor/Treasurer .

It was moved by Tom Roeschlein, and seconded by Dave Ulstrom, and **carried** unanimously to approve the following resolution:
